Dear Parent/Carer

We have been approached by Nottingham Trent University, alongside other schools, asking for students, parents/carers and staff to take part in University based research which focuses on online activity and, in particular, behaviour which could be deemed as risky.

At Northampton School *for Boys*, we have engaged the students with various schemes of work in Citizenship and Guidance, Enterprise Week and in one off awareness sessions. This has included Kayleigh's Love Story and work with Service Six in order to highlight the issues that the internet can present when not used thoughtfully and the consequences that this might have immediately and long term. This also falls alongside work on anti-bullying (The Be Nice Bus and Anti-Bullying Week) and Mental Health (Service Six/Up Front Theatre Company). The surveys will take place between 30 January and the end of Term 3 (9 February).

If you wish to discuss the content of the survey please contact the University; for any other issues please contact me. They are also asking for parents/carers and staff to participate so they can compare data for those of school age with adults. If you choose to access the parental survey it will give you an awareness of the type of questions covered and you could then, if you were unsure, make an informed decision on whether you wanted your child to participate.
