 Enter the Sports Hall in silence – do not communicate with your peers

 Take seats quickly, do not write anything, open booklets, or interact with anybody



Exams will finish at various times, there may still be students sitting exams in the Sports Hall – Remain silent until you <u>LEAVE</u> the Sports Hall building


# Advice and support


# Results Day – Thurs 15<sup>th</sup> Aug

- Exact details will be on the school website in the coming weeks
- If you are not going to be able to access results, you need to inform the school if a parent/guardian will be on site.
  - They will need to present ID to collect results on your behalf.



# Appeals and University admissions

- UCAS and Clearing Service SBB to contact and advise where necessary.
- When collecting results, there will be a YELLOW letter. This needs completing to allow us to ACCESS SCRIPTS.
  - This <u>does not</u> allow us to request a 'Review of Marking' (remark), but the school can get your script to review this can only happen once scripts have been reviewed.
  - All students should complete this!
- If the school supports a Review of Marking, you will need to complete a GREEN letter. This can <u>only</u> be signed AFTER scripts have been recalled.
- If the school supports a review, the cost of this is covered by NSB.
- Reviews can only be for examination modules.
