Rugby Development Youth Coach

LINE MANAGER: Director of Rugby

All staff are expected to:

Rugby Development Youth Coach

Responsibility for the support and delivery of technical sessions to one year group Rugby squad on aspects of play to further develop their technical expertise within the game. To coach (with support) and develop within an age group squad up to 4 teams to compete against other private and state schools. Ideally the candidate will be a Licenced Coach or aspiring with at least RFU Level 1 or 2 coaching qualifications or equivalent experience from a professional playing background.

Sessions and to be negotiated but within the Rugby calendar and will be between 3:45pm and 5:30pm, Monday to Thursday. The Rugby season runs September to February. Remuneration will be based on sessions agreed between Director of Rugby and Director of Sport.

Specific Roles and responsibilities of Rugby Development Youth Coach

Job Purpose

To support the Director of Rugby and associated coaches in the preparation of a squad of school based rugby players, to compete successfully in all relevant games and competitions and to provide sessions at appropriate times in the rugby calendar to improve technique, skill and game management. Through engagement with Clubs and Schools, to further enhance the reputation of Rugby at Northampton School *for Boys* across the region. To co-ordinate and deliver specific specialist skills coaching to identified forward players within each team as agreed in conjunction with the Director of Rugby.

Major Tasks, Duties and Responsibilities

1. Support for students

- Within the defined area of coaching ensure that every identified player receives appropriate coaching techniques at team and individual levels.
- To assist by advice on the development and implementation of a coaching programme for each team, working with other members of the coaching management team to identify, develop and implement successful training and playing strategies.
- Design, coordinate, and implement individual, unit and team developments.
- Introduce techniques learnt in the professional game to develop excellence in young players

2. Support for the School

- Be aware of and comply with all policies and procedures relating to safeguarding, health, safety and security, confidentiality and data protection, inclusive learning and all policies pertinent to the role
- Be aware of and ensure all students have equal access to opportunities to learn and develop
- Contribute to the overall ethos/work/aims of the school
- Recognise own strengths and areas of expertise and use these to advise and support others
