Allocated seating:

It's important to know where you will be sitting

Your seat will be different in each exam

Concentrate on finding your seat and getting yourself organized

Invigilators can help – your friends can't!





Location: Sports Hall*

Seating is allocated:

- Check the seating plan on display
- Go to your desk quickly and quietly
- Put equipment on desk
- Water bottle allowed (no label)

No...

- Coats
- Bags
- Calculator lids with instructions
- Food
- Revision materials









You'll need equipment for each paper:

- Maths calculator, pencil, ruler, protractor
- DT colouring pencils
- English highlighter

Be prepared:

- You are responsible for bring your equipment to the exam hall

Be ready for lessons in between:

- When you are not in an exam, you are in timetabled lessons
- This might mean going to a lesson part-way through
- Teachers know when exams finish and will expect you to be prompt
