Information for candidates

The following information explains what may happen following a clerical re-check, a review of marking and any subsequent appeal.

If your school or college submits a request for a clerical re-check or a review of the original marking, and then a subsequent appeal, for one of your examinations after your subject grade has been issued, there are three possible outcomes:

- Your original mark is lowered, so your final grade may be lower than the original grade you received.
- Your original mark is confirmed as correct, so there is no change to your grade.
- Your original mark is raised, so your final grade may be higher than the original grade you received.

To proceed with the clerical re-check or review of marking, you **must** sign the form below. This tells the head of your school that you have understood what the outcome might be, and that you give your consent to the clerical re-check or review of marking being submitted. There is no charge to the candidate if the school decides to proceed with a clerical re-check or Review of Marking.

How do you request a Review of Results?

1. Decide which type of review you would like (see table below for options).

Please be aware that following a review your final subject grade and/or mark awarded may be lower than, higher than, or the same as the result which was originally awarded. If you are unsure whether to request a clerical re-check or review of marking you can request a priority copy script to help you decide.

2. Complete the consent form (overleaf).

Only the candidate can sign the form, parents/ carers cannot request a review on behalf of the candidate.

3. Give consent form and payment to Mrs Round in the Exams Office before noon on deadline the date.

Fees are per exam paper and are listed below with the relevant deadline (please note earlier deadline for priority requests). Requests cannot be processed until payment is received. Make cheques payable to Northampton School *for Boys* and write a separate cheque for each request. We hold cheques until the review decision is received and if the grade is increased, the cheque will be destroyed because the exam board do not charge for the review.

N.B. Reviews supported by the school will be paid for by NSB.
