



## Advice for Y9 and 10 students on remote learning arrangements for 16<sup>th</sup> March 2023

Following Mr Bernard's letter to all parents/carers regarding the impact of strike action by members of the National Education Union, I wanted to provide further details about the arrangements for remote learning on Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> March.

### What to expect if your child is in Y9 or 10:

All students will receive the equivalent of their normal timetable of 7 x 45min lessons across the day with a scheduled break at 10:30-10:50 (Y10) or 11:15-11:35 (Y9) and lunch between 13:05 and 14:05 – mirroring the school day at NSB. It is essential that students follow their normal timetable on Thursday and check Microsoft Teams for live lessons in the first instance. There will not be a PD registration lesson in the morning – students should be ready to start their first lesson at 9am.

All students can access Teams via the link on the VLE ([NSB Moodle \(mynsb.co.uk\)](https://mynsb.co.uk)) or by downloading the Teams app onto a phone or tablet device and logging in with their NSB username and password. Once they are logged in, students can expect to see pop-up invites to join each live lesson during the day – these will appear at the start of each timetabled lesson. All students know to ensure they can access Teams before Thursday and log-in to their account.

Students have been directed to wait 5 minutes on Teams at the start of each lesson. If they have not received an invite to join their live lesson during that time, this may be due to several reasons:

- a) The teacher may be on strike.
- b) The teacher may be absent for other reasons.

In the absence of a live lesson, students have been directed to access alternative work on the VLE via a dedicated remote learning page: [Course: Remote Learning - Thurs 16th March \(mynsb.co.uk\)](https://mynsb.co.uk). Students can navigate to their timetabled subject and complete the tasks and resources that link directly to the curriculum and the current schemes of work. Some of these resources have been created by subject teachers whilst others have been taken from Oak National Academy, BBC Bitesize or similar resources to support structured study.

For context, the format and nature of alternative work in the absence of a live lesson will vary as teachers who are on strike will not prepare or set work for students on a strike day and non-striking teachers cannot be directed or compelled to set work or to cover in a striking teacher's absence. Additionally, the school will not be fully aware of which teachers are striking until Thursday morning.

All students in Y9 and 10 have already received their assembly to outline the expectations of remote learning on Thursday and how to access their full curriculum during the day.
