Self-employment is when you work for yourself as a freelancer, contractor, or business owner rather than for an employer. This means you take full responsibility for the business's success, risks, and tax payments.

A FACT ABOUT EMPLOYMENT

There were an estimated 2.4m creative industry jobs in the UK between April 2024 and March 2025, according to data published by the Department for Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS).

Around 30% of creative industry jobs are self-employment.
