GRANT APPLICATION FORM

The Charity is for promoting the education or vocational training of young persons who have been residents of Northampton for a minimum of 5 years, are over the age of 16 years and under the age of 25 years, and who are in need of financial assistance.

As the Trustees make grants direct to Moulton College and Northampton College, the Trustees will not make grants to students from these Colleges.

All Grants (of up to a maximum of $\pounds 1,000$) are made at the discretion of the Trustees of the Charity. In considering any applications for grants the Trustees shall have regard to the historic objects of the Charity which are set out below:

In promoting the education (including social and physical training) of young people, over the age of sixteen years and under the age of twenty five years, who are in need of financial assistance, <u>are</u> <u>resident in Northampton</u> (and have been <u>for at least five years</u>), and who are attending full time or part time courses of education or vocational training

e.g. by way of illustration, Grants have been awarded to help pay for tools, instruments, books, art materials or specialised equipment, and for the costs to applicants of training for a trade.

The Trustees have complete rights to select a candidate for a Grant.

The Trustees will check to see that the student does attend the courses.

The Trustees shall also take into account the funds available to the Trustees for Grants.

The Trustees have agreed that, subject to funds being available, students at university may apply for a grant each academic year they attend, subject also to receipt of proof of attendance.

For full details of the Scheme, please contact the Clerk.

The Trustees meet four times a year to consider applications, and your application form must be completed and returned to the Clerk's Offices at least two weeks before a meeting, for this to be circulated to the Trustees. Any not received in time to be circulated to the Trustees, will be held over until the next meeting.

Please note that we do not acknowledge receipt of completed application forms.

Grants meetings will be held in March, April, September and October. Please note that we do not notify applicants if a date for a grants meeting is changed. Please therefore ensure that you send your application form in in good time in case a meeting is brought forward.

Please note that the Trustees' decision is final, and they will not enter into correspondence on decisions made.
